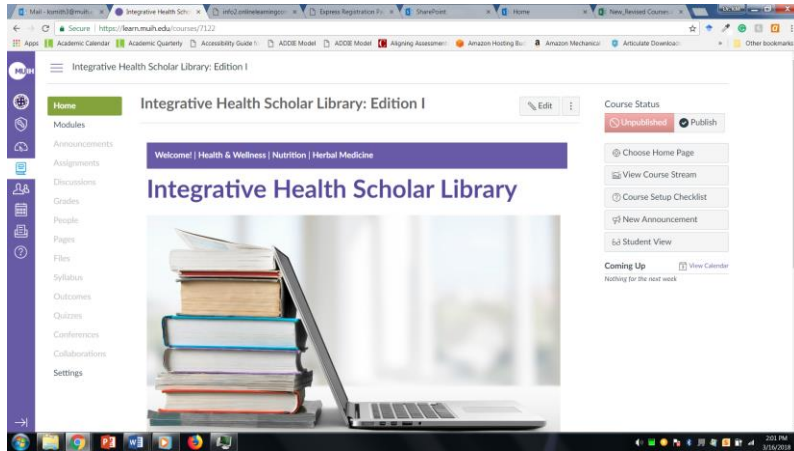

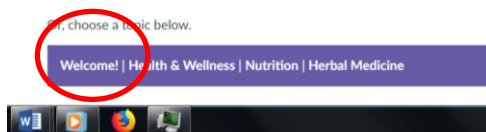

--The "Welcome" link doesn't lead anywhere if you click on it from the homepage. It's not needed here as this is the page in question.



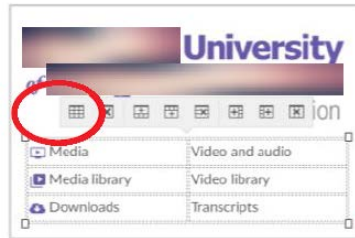
--Increase the text in the purple bars to either 18 font or bold 14.

--Caption the homepage info box with "About this course:"

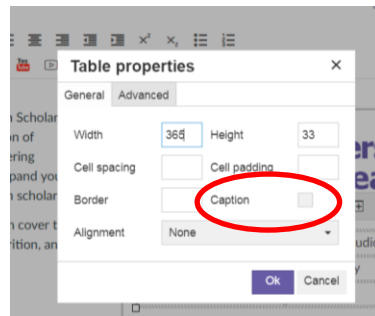


Here's how:

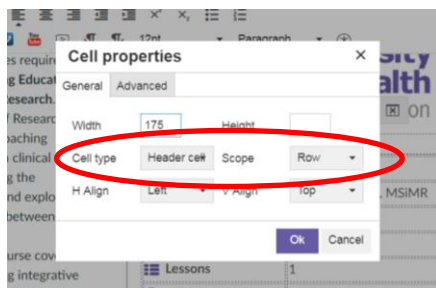
- Go to Edit
- Select the table



- Choose properties
- Click the box for captions



--In addition to table captions add row header properties to all items on the left side of the table. Below is an example.



--It may be helpful if the topics contained in the webinars are outlined on the homepage. This may prevent users from finding difficulty in what pertains to them as the topics are varied.

--As I'm aware that the content comes from the SME, be sure to check grammar. For example, in just **one** module, I made the below grammatical updates as well others throughout the pages.

- Replaced "like" with "about" or "regarding" ("like" is a preposition and always should come before a noun)

- Removed the “s” from “contributes” (avoid single verbs with plural subjects)
- Removed the “s” from “increases”
- Added “the” in front of “risk”
- Changed back yard to backyard
- Changed jewel weed to jewelweed
- Avoid cloudy antecedents (starting sentences with “this” may confuse some users, especially if they don’t know what “this” is referring to)
- Added “an” in front of “incentive” (a noun phrase needs a determiner to identify the type of group)
- Changed “spring time” to “springtime”
- Changed “to instead use them in culinary preparations” to “to use them in culinary preparations instead” (This was a split infinitive. The to-infinitive “to use” was split by the modifier “instead”)
- Removed the comma after “dishes”
- Changed “sought after” to “sought-after”
- Removed “individual” after “their” (This is tautological – repeating the same thing using different words)
- Replaced “on a verge of” with “on **the** verge of” (incorrect article)
- Added “a” in front of “great”
- Added comma after “spoken” (commas are needed for a coordinating conjunction in a compound sentence)
- Removed “individual” after “our” (This is tautological - repeating the same thing using different words)
- Changed “milks” to “milk” (“milk” is an uncountable noun and should not be made plural – we can’t count how many milks someone has)
- Avoid passive tense “salad dressing with be shared” was changed to present tense
- Changed “saturate” to “saturated”
- Changed “There are many lifestyle factors that go...” to “Many lifestyle factors go...”
- Changed “Looking for alternatives to oils?” to “Are you looking for alternatives to oils?” (sentence fragment)
